Come back from career setbacks

with the SkillsFuture Jobseeker Support (JS) scheme



The scheme aims to guide involuntarily unemployed jobseekers through a series of job search and skills upgrading activities to re-enter employment.

Jobseekers involuntarily unemployed from 1 Apr 2024 for over 6 months may still qualify if they meet all criteria and apply by 15 Jun 2025.

To support jobseekers in finding a job that makes better use of their skills and experiences, eligible applicants can receive temporary financial support of up to \$6,000 over 6 months. The monthly payouts are capped at the jobseeker's past average gross monthly income. The monthly payouts stop when the jobseeker secures a job.




Maximum monthly payouts




If your past average gross monthly income is lower than the amount listed, you will receive your past average gross monthly income instead. For example, a jobseeker with a past average gross monthly income of \$900 will not receive more than \$900 in the monthly payouts.


Who is eligible?



- Jobseekers aged 21 and above¹, earning an average gross monthly income of \leq \$5,000* in the past 12 months
- Previously employed in Singapore for at least 6 months in the past 12 months
- Became unemployed due to involuntary reasons - retrenchment, cessation of business, dismissal or termination due to illness, injury or accident
- · Live in a property in Singapore with Annual Value** of up to \$31,000
- Applications for Singapore citizens open from April 2025.
- Permanent Residents may apply in Q1 2026.
 Inclusive of bonuses, allowances and overtime pay, before CPF contributions.
- ** You may find out about the Annual Value of your residential property through the IRAS portal or through Myinfo via Singpass.

How to apply?





- · Official letter or notification of termination/dismissal by former employer
- If you were terminated due to medical reasons, please provide a medical certificate or an official letter from the medical institution/doctor



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to check your eligibility and apply using your Singpass

How to qualify?



Jobseekers can receive payouts as they play their part in their search journey by actively taking part in the activities-based system (i.e., at least 10 points/month for the first 3 months, and at least 5 points/month for the next 3 months).

There is a cap on the number of times you can earn points from these activities per month, except those indicated as 'No limit'.
